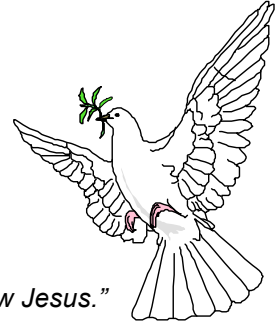

## THE THIRTY HOURS

The students had started fasting right after their lunch at school that Friday, which for some was as early as 11:00 AM. Knowing their next real meal wouldn't be until 6:00 PM the next day, they trudged into the church at 4:00, lugging their sleeping bags, pillows, overnight bags and backpacks. "Boys in the nursery, girls in the Pellerin Room!" After some initial greetings and catching up with friends, we hauled out the cardboard, duct tape and tarps and everyone set to work constructing shelters in which they'd spend the night. Sure, we'd have the church roof over our heads, but at least it helped us to imagine that cardboard and tarps might be all that stood between some people and the unpredictable New England weather.

"Water, drink plenty of water," I constantly reminded them – we didn't want anyone to get dehydrated. Every few hours we offered the option of some juice or a piece of fruit to help ward off headaches and feeling faint. In a culture where most of us rarely go three waking hours without some sort of snack, our kids had volunteered to go thirty hours without food to raise money to help fight hunger around the world. Our goal was to raise \$3000 - the final total was closer to \$4000! Pretty amazing since in the past we'd never raised more than \$1000 through the Famine. But more amazing than the amount of money raised, or even than the wondrous shine on Jim's freshly shaven head at the end of the Famine, was seeing God at work in our midst.

Because, believe it or not, as The Thirty Hours wore on, I realized more and more that it wasn't really about the money. Although we'd initially set out to experience in a small

way what it feels like to go without food and at the same time raise money for World Vision, as time progressed The Thirty Hours began to take on more of the Biblical pattern of fasting as a means to better focus on God and prayer. We saw God weave together the individual events we leaders had planned – the movie "The Blind Side", devotionals, games, food pantry shopping, etc. – to draw us all closer to each other and to Him. A simple object lesson with toy sunglasses led to an amazing discussion of what it means to see others through the eyes of Christ. Kids who had to leave the famine for a few hours for school commitments were eager to get back, having successfully managed to resist the pizza or burgers or sweets being served at the events.

Sometime on Saturday afternoon, usually the most difficult and most stressful time of the Famine, I suddenly realized that I was actually having fun. When people would ordinarily be tired and hungry and irritable and losing patience with everyone around them, they instead were happy and relaxed and enjoying themselves. Kids napped as needed, and everyone participated in creating the giant collage to be hung in the church for Sunday morning. Before we knew it, 5:30 had arrived, the appointed time for "THE SHAVING," and by 6:15 we were gathered around the table, thanking God for the food and for those who had prepared it. And somewhere in there I realized that God is doing a new thing in the youth group here at First Baptist, and what a blessing it is to be able to be a part of it!

prayer for each other, our church, our community, our nation and our world.

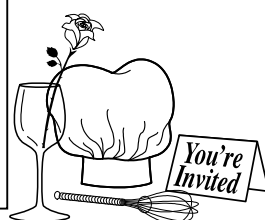
**BABY BOTTLE BENEFIT COMING!!!**

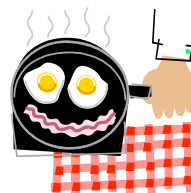


**JESUS SAID, "FEED MY SHEEP"**
